Your Excellency,

I refer to previous discussions in PSC and COTER and the guidance of the 19 June 2017 Foreign Affairs Council Conclusion to maintain and expand the network of Counterterrorism experts to EU Delegations.

In this context, I am pleased to inform you that we are seeking applications from Member States for a "cost-free" national expert (SNE) for secondment to the Delegation of the European Union to Egypt, pursuant to the Decision of the High Representative of 04.02.2014 establishing the rules applicable to SNEs^[1].

Within the attached broad job description, the concrete job content will be further specified in a subsequent Mission Letter based on the situation and priorities in Egypt. In this context, building capacity, reporting/analysis and local coordination in the area of security and counterterrorism will remain the key tasks expected from the SNE.

The SNE will work under the direct supervision of the Head of Delegation and will be called to work directly with relevant colleagues both from the Delegation and from Headquarters. Following the EEAS practice and legal framework, the SNE will be considered as staff members of the EEAS.

I would be obliged if you could forward the enclosed profile to the various relevant Ministries in order to generate adequate applications. Ideally, we are looking at candidates with a rule of law background (police, judiciary) as well as experience in Security Sector Reform and Counterterrorism issues. Field experience is a comparative advantage as are local language skills.

Applications should be sent by your Permanent Representation by e-mail to: SNE-Delegations@eeas.europa.eu. They shall not be sent directly to the Delegations.

Candidates shall draft their CV in English or in French in a PDF or Word version, following the European CV form which can be found at the following internet address: <http://europass.cedefop.europa.eu/en/documents/curriculum-vitae>

Candidates should specify that they are applying for the Counterterrorism expert position in the Delegation of the EU to Egypt. Only applications received in the above-mentioned format by **25 August 2018 at 12.00hrs** will be considered for this call for applications.

Applications will be examined by the EEAS which will organise selection interviews.

Please note that the delivery of a security clearance (minimum level EU SECRET / SECRET UE) is a prerequisite for all postings as an SNE to the EEAS.

I would like to invite you to draw the attention of the various relevant Ministries and services to the proper treatment of personal data and inform them that the EEAS implements data protection rules according to Council Regulation (EC) n° 45/2001. Possible applicants should therefore be informed that their CV will be circulated to EEAS services involved in the selection and management of their possible secondment, as well as within the Delegation concerned.

I take this opportunity to thank you very much for your cooperation and I look forward to a rapid deployment of this expert as an important contribution to EU efforts in the fight against terrorism and radicalisation.
