Job description

A. Tasks and Responsibilities:

Under the direct supervision of the Head of the Mission Support Division, the Fleet and Transport Expert is expected to perform the following tasks:

- Assist in the planning, analysis, design, programming and implementation of all aspects of vehicle fleet management and transport needs of Civilian Crisis Management Operations and civilian CSDP Missions (Missions);
- Develop, prepare, coordinate and monitor overall fleet management plans including forecasting, supply schedules, priorities or requirements, and resolution of urgent operational needs:
- Assist in the development of policies and procedures for Mission Support in the field;
- Contribute to the relevant work aimed at the definition of standard equipment for the Missions;
- Contribute to the relevant work aimed at the definition of technical specifications and terms of reference for the launching of Framework Contracts and other means of acquisition;
- Ensure the implementation and subsequent follow-up of a comprehensive centralised ERP and Electronic Fleet Management tool across all Missions;
- Develop an inventory and rotation of assets policy for the Missions;
- Act as the liaison between the Missions, relevant EEAS Services and CPCC for vehicle and transport matters;
- Participate in Technical Assessment Missions, Technical Survey Missions etc.;
- Organise and chair logistics planning meetings related to fleet and vehicles;
- Assist in preparing inventory reports as appropriate and be responsible for the production of reports concerning CSDP Fleet issues;
- Manage, as appropriate, rapid deployment stocks/start-up kits;
- Liaise and coordinate as appropriate with the relevant counterparts, including other Institutions.

B. Qualifications and Experience:

- Successful completion of university studies of at least 3 years attested by a diploma at Bachelor's level equivalent to level 6 in the European Qualifications Framework and the first cycle under the framework of qualifications of the European Higher Education Area;
- Proven professional experience (minimum 6 years) in the area of Logistics and Fleet Management, preferably in large private or in public institutions, international organisations, NGOs or other similar actors;
- Knowledge of Supply Chain Management and awareness of products and services, markets

- and industrial business networks;
- Solid large scale project management and implementation skills;
- Attestable good skills in Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) and Integrated Resource Management Software (IRMS);
- Experience with CSDP Missions in the field of Transport and Logistics would be an asset;

C. Other Requirements/Skills:

- To be able to work professionally as a member of the Division, in task forces and working groups with mixed composition (other Mission-support related tasks as well as with police, judicial, civilian and military staff), in an interesting but challenging environment with unpredictable working hours and a considerable workload;
- Willingness to travel frequently and on short notice into Mission and conflict areas;
- Rigorous approach towards administrative and financial rules;
- Good skills in word processing, spreadsheets, presentations software, Internet/Intranet, use of email systems;
- Thorough command of written and spoken English and sound report writing skills, sufficient knowledge of French.
