- Bosko TONEV, Assistant Federal Secretary for Finance of the Yugoslav Government, toured the US 28th September through 25th November under State Department auspices.
- Senator Warren MAGNUSON of the Senate Commerce Committee visited Bulgaria in connection with America Day at the Plovdiv Fair (28th September). Bulgarian Premier Todor ZHIVKOV received Senator MAGNUSON and USIA Director Leonard MARKS on 28th September.
- Secretary RUSK and Polish Foreign Minister RAPACKI met on 23rd September, 1966 during the 21st UNGA Session.
- Secretary RUSK met Rumanian Foreign Minister MANESCU in New York during UNGA 5th October, 1966.
- Secretary RUSK met Hungarian Foreign Minister Janos PETER on 6th October, 1966 while both were in New York at UNGA.
- Secretary RUSK met with Czechoslovak Foreign Minister Vaclav DAVID during UNGA, New York, October 1966.

- Secretary RUSK met with Yugoslav Foreign Minister NIKEZIC on 6th October in New York during UNGA.
 - Polish Vice Foreign Minister Jozef WINIEWICZ had conversation with Under Secretary Eugene ROSTOW on 21st October and Acting Deputy Under Secretary Llewellyn THOMPSON on 22nd October in Washington.
 - A broad range of contacts with Soviet Government officials resulted from visits to the USSR by Senator Joseph CLARK from 21st November through 24th November, and Senator Joseph TYDINGS from 23rd November through 28th November.
 - By mutual agreements, US legations in Sofia and Budapest and Hungarian and Bulgarian legations in Washington were raised to embassies on 28th November.
 - High level Department and Interior Officers met with Soviet officials in Moscow the end of July to negotiate a fisheries agreement.
 - Secretary RUSK met with Soviet Foreign Minister GROMYKO at the opening of UNGA. GROMYKO met with the President and Secretary RUSK in Washington 10th October.
 - Senator Warren MAGNUSON visited Moscow 30th September and met with Soviet Minister of Fisheries ISHKOV before departing 3rd October.
- C - NEGOTIATIONS, AGREEMENTS AND CONTACTS ON CULTURAL, ECONOMIC AND TECHNICAL MATTERS
- During this period, US-Yugoslav exchange program continued to be active with other prominent Yugoslavs in such fields as education, radio-television, literature, touring US under State Department auspices.
 - Janez VIPOTNIK, Yugoslav Federal Secretary for Education and Culture, toured the US 28th September through 2nd November under State Department auspices.
 - A delegation of three members of the Yugoslav Council of Academies of Science toured the US 17th September through 3rd October under the auspices of the National Academy of Sciences, returning a visit by the US Delegation to Yugoslavia last year.
 - The third round of US-Hungarian talks on claims was held in Washington 8th June through 21st, 1966.
 - The officially-sponsored US Trade Mission visited Budapest 15th October through 28th, 1966.

- Dr. Donald F. HORNIG, the President's Science Adviser, met with Rumanian President STOICA 29th September, 1966 while attending the centennial celebration of the Rumanian Academy in Bucharest.
- Pursuant to the statement and understanding signed between the National Academy of Sciences and the Czechoslovak Academy of Sciences, a three-man American delegation paid a two-week visit to Czechoslovakia in September in return for a visit to the US of a delegation of the Czechoslovak Academy of Sciences earlier this year.
- The officially-sponsored US Trade Mission visited Bulgaria from 1st October to 14th, 1966.
- Assistant Secretary for Economic Affairs SOLOMON visited Bucharest and met with Rumanian Foreign Trade Minister CIOARA 14th October, 1966.
- Consular convention negotiations with Poland are continuing.
- Civil air agreement with USSR signed 4th November, 1966.
